Sunny (the Parrot) - My mother was a speech pathologist and wanted to teach a bird how to talk, so she got Sunny, a yellow-naped Amazon parrot. The Thanksgiving before my mother passed 3 years ago, I flew to Dallas and brought Sunny back to Idaho. When we went through TSA, I had her in a travelling cage with a towel over it. The TSA Agent asked me what I had in the cage and when I told her, she asked me if she spoke. Then on cue, Sunny loudly said, "Get me out!". She has been a great addition to our home and reminds me of my mother every day.

Bella - My mother had Alzheimers and when her dog died, she kept walking around her house crying and wondering where her dog was. One Saturday morning when my older sister was brushing her teeth, she saw on the local news that Bella was up for adoption. She took my mother to the Pet Rescue and with one look at Bella, she had a new forever home. She was like a service dog to my mother and would not leave her side. When my mother passed away, I flew to Dallas and brought Bella home to Idaho with me. She is a wonderful little dog and we adore her! It is hard to believe that she was in foster homes and no one ever adopted her, but then again, I think she was meant for my mother and for us!

Lucy -(Not in the photoshoot) - In December 2014, Tom and I were in Park City, UT, visiting his sister for Christmas, when our neighbor called and asked if we wanted to come and see the kitten that her niece deposited in her barn. After a 4-hour drive home, we stopped by her barn and looked at Lucy. We were tired and went home. That night, I had dreams about that kitten. SO, the next morning, I told Tom we needed to go back and look at the kitten again. I brought a large towel with me and Tom had no idea. When we went into the barn, Lucy came out of a hay bale and I wrapped her the towel. She has been with us ever since.

Tessy - (the black & white cat) - When we picked up Lucy, we already had a cat named Gracie. When she passed in 2017, Tom and I decided to go to the Animal Shelter and look at the new kittens. There was a room filled with them. Tom sat down on a chair in that room and this little black and white kitten walked up his right leg and onto his shoulder to get to the food that was on the counter behind Tom and then returned to the floor the same way. When I asked Tom which kitten should we take, he pointed to the black and white one. I am so glad we did because she was the only kitten that contracted an upper respiratory infection and we had to take her to the vet twice for antibiotics and then had to force-feed her. I actually think Tessy picked us because I am sure someone else might have not gotten her the care that she needed.

She completes the "zoo" that we affectionately call our animals and we love them all.
